*"The scenery and landscape in and around Queenstown is so utterly exquisite that I'm not ashamed to say that it made me cry". **South Isle, New Zealand.***

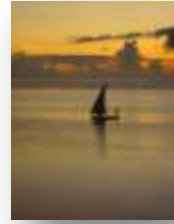
